APPLICATION FOR CONSENT TO ASSIGN LICENSES

1) The following two FM translators are compliant with Title 47 CFR Sections 74.1232 (d) and (e):

- **K290AA 105.9 MHz Seldovia, AK Facility ID # 52163**

Rebroadcasts KGTL AM Homer, AK Facility ID # 52152

- **K292ED 106.3 MHz Kachemak City, AK Facility ID # 52150**

2) The following 12 FM translators are subject to an exemption from CFR Sections 74.1232 (d) & (e) **provided by law** known as the "Alaska Exception" set forth in the Communications Act of 1934, **Title 47 U.S. Code Section 307 - Licenses (f) Areas in Alaska without access to over the air broadcasts**, as amended by Congress in 2005, which states...

"(2) any holder of a broadcast license who has broadcast to an area of Alaska that did not have access to over the air broadcasts via translator, microwave, or other alternative signal delivery may continue providing such service even if another holder of a broadcast license begins broadcasting to such an area, and shall not be fined or subject to any other penalty, forfeiture, or revocation related to providing such service including any fine, penalty, forfeiture, or revocation for continuing to operate notwithstanding orders to the contrary."

The Assignee, Peninsula Radio Group, Inc. (PRGI) bought the Primary Stations that are rebroadcast on the 12 FM translator stations listed below effective January 1, 2025. Therefore, PRGI qualifies as a holder of broadcast licenses that are broadcasting to areas of Alaska that "may continue providing such service...and shall not be fined or subject to any other penalty, forfeiture, or revocation related to providing such service for continuing to operate notwithstanding orders to the contrary."

It is clear that the intent of Congress was, by adding Section 307 (f) to the Communications Act, that broadcast services licensed in Alaska are valuable and protected by law to provide continued service and can remain on the air even if the circumstances for the initial license grant might change. For Alaska, it is the law and not FCC policy, that determines license grants. The only state with such an exception.

Mr. Gary Rose, Managing Member, formed TBC, LLC in November of 1999. Mr. Rose brought first-time FM translator service to many remote areas of Alaska that were without, or very minimal, broadcast service. Mr. Rose has built 33 FM translators in 10 small towns around the state of Alaska over nearly 27 years. Mr. Rose is a retired U.S. Air Force officer, Lt. Colonel, and a retired SouthWest Airlines Captain that has flown 737 jet aircraft thousands of miles all over the country. Mr. Rose recently had his birthday at 82 years old and has chosen to retire (for the third time) from radio broadcasting. Mr. Rose has sought to find potential buyers for the TBC FM translators over the past 2 years. However, none were found except the proposed Assignee Peninsula Radio Group, Inc., the owner of the Primary stations carried on these 14 FM translators proposed to be sold.

It is in the Public Interest to keep these FM translators on the air and to provide uninterrupted continued broadcast service to these rural Alaska communities by granting the instant application for Consent to Assign Licenses.
